

Storyboard That Assignment 1 - Sociological Imagination

Assignment: Create a 3 panel comic to demonstrate understanding of Soc. Imagination.

Requirements:

- 1) You **MUST** include 2 quotes from our text(s) sources about the topic in your comic. It can be in the speech or thought bubbles within the comic, or it can be in the header/footer.
- 2) You **MUST** label (in the header or footer) each of the panels as they occur in your comic. These labels direct the viewer's attention to the point of the comic overall, or to the action taking place in the panel. One of the panels **HAS** to be labeled with the main concept that we are working with. Example: Sociological Imagination or Looking Glass Self
- 3) You will not be graded for art proficiency, but your comic strip must demonstrate effort. Your work should be thoughtful, insightful, and preferably funny!!!
 - a) Scoring
 - i) 5/15 demonstrating clear understanding of **OVERALL** sociological concept
 - ii) 5/15 clearly demonstrating understanding of sub-components (vocabulary or theories) of sociological concept
 - iii) 5/15 effort and participation

Process:

- 1) IF you are going to make this comic as artwork on a piece of paper, you have to have some artistic skill or be dedicated to the effort of making it work. That method is absolutely OK, but stick figures thrown on the sheet will be knocked on the effort score.
 - a) There are several ways to share your work. Some folks take a screen grab and throw the work into a different kind of file. Some folks email it to themselves. Some print it to a pdf. Others know what to do and just do it. Whatever method that you choose, I want an e-copy shared with me submitted into classroom.
- 2) It is preferred that you use www.storyboardthat.com to complete your work. You **MUST** make an account with your school email so that your work can be saved. Not doing so, and losing work, is your fault!
