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This week, my daughter Ryann's girls under-12 soccer team played to a 2-2 draw against Waltham. Here is a quick summary of what happened.

On Saturday morning in Waltham, two horrible calls made by a soccer referee led to the game ending in 2-2 tie between the Wilmington and Waltham GU-12 teams. Wilmington fell behind 1-0 early, but played their hearts out and put themselves in a perfect position to win off of late game goals by Samantha (46th minute) and Talia (50th minute). After the goal by Talia, the referee allowed the game to continue, even though it appeared that the game clock had expired. Because of his decision to allow the game to continue, Waltham had time to take the kickoff, hurry the ball down the field and run directly into a defender.
